

Haiku!

Haiku is a type of Japanese poetry. A haiku doesn't rhyme and is only 3 lines long! The first and last lines of a Haiku have 5 syllables and the middle line has 7 syllables.

A syllable is a single sound or beat in a word. For example, 'arm-chair' has two syllables, whilst 'ad-ven-tures' has three. Say each word out loud and clap out each beat to count how many syllables there are.

> Haiku are often written about nature. Can you guess what animal this haiku is about? Green and speckled legs,

> > Write a haiku about a cool animal! Can your friends and family guess which animal it's about?
